

The Wilmot Transfer Station is available to residents only. Each vehicle should have a current Transfer Station sticker clearly visible to the attendants. Stickers are available from the Town Clerk. To reduce disposal costs, the Selectmen encourage everyone to recycle as much as possible. If you have suggestions, or want to help, please call the town offices at 526 - 4802.

As a Wilmot taxpayer it costs you 5 cents per pound to dispose of waste. Lower your taxes by practicing the three R's:

- Reduce
- Reuse
- Recycle

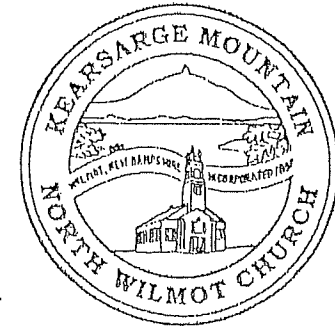

## Wilmot Recycles

### Glass Bottles and Jars

Rinse and remove caps

### Plastic Food, Beverage & Laundry containers numbers 1 - 7

Rinse, remove caps, and crush

### Aluminum and Steel Cans

Rinse

### Mixed Paper

Flattened cardboard boxes, any paper, junk mail, magazines, newspaper - anything that rips

### Waste Oil

See attendant

### Rechargeable Household Batteries

Place in appropriate container

### Scrap Metal

Place in appropriate pile -

No picking for safety reasons

### Cell Phones, Pagers, and PDA's

Place in appropriate container

### Fluorescent Bulbs

See attendant

### Ink Jet Cartridges

Place in appropriate container

### Propane Tanks - \$5.00 see attendant

### Appliances Containing Refrigerant

\$15.00 fee for Refrigerators and

Freezers - (remove doors) Air

Conditioners, Dehumidifiers

### Computers, Monitors and Printers, and microwave ovens

\$5.00 - \$10.00 see attendant

## Hazardous Waste

The following items are considered hazardous waste and will not be accepted at the Transfer Station: acids, aerosols, ammonia based cleaners, anti-freeze, button batteries, disinfectants, drain openers, flea powder, furniture polish, household cleaners, toilet bowl cleaners, oven cleaners, insecticides, herbicides, pesticides, gasoline, kerosene, transmission fluid, moth balls, oil based paints, paint removers, paint thinners, turpentine, varnish, photo chemicals, rust removers.

Water based paint (latex) and stain can be deposited in the compactor if they are hard and dry. Mixing with kitty litter may help dry the paint.

There is a Hazardous Waste Collection Day every year that we share with other towns in the Sunapee Region. Please check with the office to find out the next collection.
